It is now 20 years since our work began rescuing and rehoming ex-racehorses, and 11 years since we moved to Wiltshire.

During this time we have looked after and rehomed many ex-racehorses, moreover we have educated over 3000 children and young people. This has not only helped them in their normal classroom environment but has also introduced them to the glory of Thoroughbreds and the joy of racing.

I must take this opportunity to thank you all, a number of whom have supported us faithfully since our faltering and sometimes shaky beginning.

Over the years, we have faced both joyful and worrying times, but I think that the sight of a well and happy horse

leaving us for a safe new home, having perhaps been found in a neglected way is perhaps the most rewarding for us all. In addition, we mustn't forget that we have not only influenced the lives of horses but also enriched the lives of a large number of students. Greatwood has made a difference to them all and we couldn't have done any of it without your help.

We are particularly grateful to Elite Racing Club for the wonderful sponsorship of our newsletter for many years.

How Greatwood has changed

When we first moved up to Greatwood from Devon, we arrived with 26 horses, geese, hens, sheep and goats. Some of the horses we have subsequently rehomed, some have succumbed to advanced years, but I am pleased to say that we still have our intrepid trio of Al, Montendre and Athletic Sam.

Moving the charity was a huge gamble, there were only 13 acres of pasture, we had negotiated the rental of further acres but it had to be ploughed up, reseeded and fenced. The buildings were in a sorry state but it still held great promise, we knew it was going to take years really to get into some sort of shape, but our funding was

the most worrying, we had arrived with a fairly substantial deficit, and money was going to be tight: even if we could survive.

Holiday Workshops:

Can you believe it's been almost a year since Greatwood began running Holiday workshops? And what a runaway success it has been. Each holiday has seen many excited children spending time with the Thoroughbreds and small animals, running about in the woods and making new friends. It



has been great to see many smiley faces and the holidays couldn't come around sooner for the animals, enjoying the extra attention from the eager students. Dig for Victory:

Despite the cold and snow, the students on our courses have begun to dig for victory by growing their own vegetables and learning about WWII. It has certainly been challenging for all involved as they have battled the elements and soldiered on, adding home grown manure to the beds, weeding and planting seeds under the welcome cover of the polytunnel. We are now beginning to see the rewards as the seeds begin to poke their heads out into the spring air. With continued care from the students we will be reaping the rewards later in the year when we will be tucking into

delicious home grown vegetables. That is if we can keep the rabbits at bay!



Get Going at Greatwood:

Continuing with our drive in helping young people who are NEET (not in education, employment or training), Greatwood successfully ran the first of 3 week long courses designed to introduce young people to a basic care in horses. The course not only provides students with the knowledge that they need if they would like to progress further into the equine industry, but it also provides them



with the fundamental skills to help them in full time employment such as time keeping and professional relationships.



Students have covered points of a horse, colours and markings and signs of a healthy horse in order to pass their course. They have all been put through many practical and stimulating tasks in order to engage them in their work and to help them remember the important information they need. Although everyone has worked hard and maintained a professional approach to tasks, we have had great fun and the students have become great friends along the way.

As always, there are many people to thank in running this course, but special mention has to go to Nick Rule, the farrier, Richard Gillat, the vet, and Alan King, who allowed us to tour his yard and watch his horses training on the gallops. These people allowed the students to gain a real insight into different aspects of working with horses and helped to inspire them all. It just goes to show the number of people that are involved in running such a fantastic course that helps young adults gain a qualification and help them onto a new and exciting pathway. We hope that some of the students will continue their journey at the Northern Racing College, who were on hand to assess their work

and give them advice on where to go next.

Despite the biting wind, the long days and personal challenges that many faced along the way, we are delighted to say that all the students passed and are now well on their way to continuing their journey along their chosen road. Massive congratulations to everybody that took part as we look forward to welcoming a new set of cohorts in the summer months.



Stars in the making:

Over the past few months, many of our students have been placed in the spotlight and have appeared on national television, heard on Wiltshire Radio and seen in the local papers! The spotlight has certainly been on and the students have all risen spectacularly to the media presence. Channel 4 and BBC Sport have cast their beady cameras on the work that we do at Greatwood and have shown the programmes on television to mark highlights in the racing calendar. Having a large camera did nothing to deter the students concentration when grooming the well behaved horses who are of course all used to the extra attention they have received in previous years on the racing track! And for those that avoided the cameras, microphones and interview style questions were a hurdle to overcome. Some would say speaking over a microphone is perhaps easier, but who's to say.

They all did a fantastic job despite being nervous and are all future stars in the making.

School Links:

A few years have passed now since Millfield School, Somerset, have started to run Greatwood's unique Horse Power programme to students in their local area. They have been doing a superb job increasing young people's self-esteem and confidence whilst working with the horses. Due to the success of this course Millfield are keen to expand on the range of courses that they offer and have spent a day with us learning all about our other courses, in particular the 10 week course, Developing Confidence Working with Animals. This newly revamped course will help many more students gain an accreditation and help them to acquire new skills which will support them in their daily lives. With more purpose for learning, interactive content, and practical activities the students are thriving in their learning and we wish Millfield all the best in running this exciting course.

With the clocks springing forward, the geese beginning to lay eggs and the horses finally being turned out into the fields, it's time to look forward to sunnier days and a seeing a spring in the students steps as they continue to make positive gains in their own personal learning here at Greatwood.
